CHORUS MUSIC away well, settled into midpack, left the opening turn four wide, was released from a snug hold on the reins coming to the end of the backstretch, ranged up into a good striking position under light coaxing during the run around the far turn still placed in the four path, unleashed a good kick when asked at the top of lane, left the sixteenth pole only a head shy of the front, wrested it away after a few strides later, then dug in with good determination to fend off the late-closing runner up. GITCHEE GOOMIE sat well reserved from off the inside for nearly three-quarters, altered course outward in the vicinity of the three-sixteenths pole for optimal racing clearance before commencing to rally, closed in with a late rush, but came up short. FRIVOLOUS BUCK raced between opponents on the far turn, spun four wide for the stretch, tipped out an additional path soon afterwards, came home willingly en route for the show. MYSTIC CITY three wide around both turns, contently stalked the pacesetter, was already under encouragement spinning her way into the stretch, fought her way to a narrow advantage during the run through the furlong grounds, held on stubbornly before relinquishing a short distance from the sixteenth pole, weakened a bit thereafter. PARAIBA off the inside, attempting to rally into contention splitting rivals in midstretch, got out finished. EXCLUSIVE SCHEME saved ground until the quarter pole. SPA CITY PRINCESS broke alertly, grabbed a quick lead and was angled over to the inside, showed the way, well rated for six furlongs, was let out as the field turned for home, offered good resistance during the ensuing furlong before yielding, tired steadily from that station. CONSIDERATE rated prompting the leader from the outside, had no response when called upon at the quarter pole.

TUTTI VA BENE three wide around both bends, folded.
