Footnotes

HILLSWICK sat forwardly placed right from the start, departed the backstretch from the three path yet pressed the issue as the widest of three one path wider during run around the bend, took over position and moved closer to the rail coming to the five-sixteenths pole, turned for home hitched up to ITSAGOODTENDOLLARS as a stretch duel commenced, with each of the main participants having been called for their best, battled hard and only heads apart with the previously mentioned rival from upper to midstretch, struck the eighth pole first, by about a neck, edged away the rest of the way under good handling. WEE FREUDIAN was put to some coaxing in the opening stages to stay within striking distance of the front runners, raced from off the inside, spun into the lane having already felt some right handed stick work, flashed belatedly energy leaving the sixteenth pole to take the place. ITSAGOODTENDOLLARS secured an inner path before an errant MAUI MARK could coming to the half mile pole, drifted into the two path soon afterwards and argued for control as the innermost member of a trio, continued the dispute with the top one once middle member of the skirmish could no longer keep up, entered the stretch on nearly even terms with the winner and got called upon, yielded just before reaching the furlong marker after showing some resistance, continued onward but got caught for place honors in the late stages. ALVITO cut the corner under a drive, came up empty. MAUI MARK drifted well out down the backstretch, while tugging at intervals on the right side of the bit, was successfully angled over towards the inside nearing the end of the backstretch but failed to rail the rail before ITS AGOODTENDOLLARS did, contested the pace from between rivals until the vicinity of the five-sixteenths pole, began to back off and was taken in hand at that station as the winner went by, drifted outward to be four wide coming into the stretch, got out even more proceeding his way to the wire, continuing to tug noticeably on the right side of the bit throughout it all.
