Footnotes

OUR AMAZING ROSE chased the solo leader on the outside then three wide on the turn, took over coming to the five-sixteenths pole, moved clear late on the bend, drew off in upper stretch and proved much the best under a brisk hand ride. SNOWBELL was urged along while off the pace, went two then three wide on the turn, shifted four wide into the stretch, drifted in under a right-handed whip near the three-sixteenths pole, was switched to a left-handed whip in the final furlong and safely secured the place. FEELS SO RIGHT was unsettled in the gate and not standing properly when the bell rung, came out awkwardly and about two lengths slow, raced on the outside while ridden along, went three then four wide on the turn, floated six wide into the stretch, drifted in a bit inside the furlong marker and was best of the rest. JERRY LOVE came in early, dropped back while hard ridden, raced near the inside early on the turn, shifted three wide late on the bend, came four wide into the stretch, drifted in near the furlong marker and tired. MOBILIZE was ridden along towards the back, went three then four wide on the turn, dropped in after turning into the stretch and failed to respond. CRYSTAL ROCKET lost her action badly outside the half-mile pole, dropped back very quickly, went three wide on the turn, moved out in upper stretch and was no factor. ZIP ON broke very fast, sped clear in a flash, set the pace while off the rail, lost the lead to the winner nearing the five-sixteenths pole, fell behind that rival and stopped badly.
