### Footnotes

ROSE'S TURN assumed a forward position after the start, was rated along prompting the pacesetter from the outside, moved up a bit to increase the pressure departing the backstretch, put the leader to the test, with the runner up lurking dangerously a short distance from the three path, was set down and emerged from the furlong grounds with a clear advantage, fended off CELEBRITY SIGHTING under a drive. CELEBRITY SIGHTING unhurried along the outside in midpack, swung into the three path for the run around the far turn, advanced into a good striking position after completing six furlongs, bid three wide late on that bend, closed in gradually on the winner in the last eighth but wasn't good enough. LANDLASH was pulled off ALPHA NOVA but not before making light contact with that opponent, settled into the back of the pack, picked up interest upon arriving on the second turn, was driven into the five path into upper stretch and rallied willingly to secure the show. QUIXSAND saved ground and lacked the necessary stretch response. A PERFECT SQUEEZE broke running and quickly established control, was taken over to the inside, cut the pace with the rider applying rating tactics, was put to test by a pair approaching the five-sixteenths pole, succumbed after putting up a brief fight and steadily tired thereafter. PYRAMYST raced along the outside, was asked for a response at the seven-sixteenths pole, came up empty, then was pulled up quickly after crossing the finish line. ALPHA NOVA bumped lightly with LANDLASH out of the gate, tucked into the pocket just prior to reaching the first turn, loosely tracked the front runners, angled out for the stretch drive, had no offering. THERE GOES MOLLY took the inside route, was already being asked for run as she made her way around the far turn, failed to reach a contending position. LONG AND LEAN unsettled just as the gate was sprung open, broke awkwardly, was outrun thereafter.
