BERNARDINI took the lead soon after the start, opened a clear advantage leaving the first turn, raced in hand while in the four path along the backstretch, continued well in hand after shaking off DR. PLEASURE approaching the quarter pole, opened a comfortable advantage in upper stretch then drew away under wraps to win as his rider pleased. MINISTER'S BID moved up from outside to contest the early pace, stalked the winner while five wide along the backstretch, remained a factor to the turn, lugged in a bit while unable to stay with the winner in upper stretch then fought back gamely to edge HEMINGWAY'S KEY for the place. HEMINGWAY'S KEY angled to the inside leaving the first turn, was unhurried for six furlongs while saving ground, closed the gap a bit along the rail entering the stretch then lacked a strong closing response. DR. PLEASURE was taken in hand while three wide on the first turn, raced well back while slightly off the rail for six furlongs, swung five wide at the quarter pole then lacked the needed response when called upon. OH SO AWESOME raced well back to the turn, swung five at the top of the stretch then checked while lugging in near the eighth pole and failed to threaten thereafter. SUNRIVER chased along the inside to the turn and gave way.
