Footnotes

ZAVATA moved up along the rail to contest the early pace, forced the pace along the inside through the turn, battled heads apart approaching the quarter pole, surged to the front at the top of the stretch, extended his lead in midstretch then drew away under strong right hand encouragement. GREAT NOTION broke a bit slowly, moved up rapidly from outside along the backstretch, raced just behind the dueling leaders while three wide between horses on the turn, brushed with FIRST BLUSH in upper stretch then outfinished TRUST N LUCK for the place. TRUST N LUCK away alertly, rushed up from outside to gain a slim early advantage, set a rapid pace under steady pressure to the top of the stretch, relinquished the lead to the winner in upper stretch then weakened from his early efforts. POSSE was taken in hand soon after the start, trailed along the backstretch, closed the gap a bit while four wide on the turn, angled out entering the stretch then lacked a strong closing bid. FIRST BLUSH was unhurried early, made a strong run while four wide to threaten approaching the quarter pole but couldn't sustain his bid. SCRIMSHAW was hustled up along the rail, chased the leaders along the inside for a half and steadily tired thereafter. SUPER FUSE away a bit slowly, failed to mount a serious rally while four wide.
