





CURULE was outrun inside early on, advanced inside on the second turn, angled out and rallied three wide into the stretch and finished gamely outside but could not get to the winner. UNSHADED was outrun early, advanced inside on the second turn, waited for room along the inside approaching the stretch, split rivals in midstretch and finished well on the rail. POSTPONED was never far back along the inside, angled out and put in a quick three wide move on the second turn then faded in the stretch. BRAVE QUEST raced with the pace along the inside on the first turn, was taken to the outside on the backstretch, came up empty when asked for run on the second turn and tired in the stretch. MILLENCOLIN showed good speed while in hand, chased along the inside on the second turn, tired in the stretch and was being eased under the wire. ALBERT THE GREAT moved up from the outside after the start, showed in front into the backstretch, set the pace along the inside, could not keep up with the winner turning for home, tired and was being eased under the wire.
