Footnotes

ROGUE VICTORY raced three wide on the first turn, settled on the outside, moved closer on the far turn, was roused nearing the quarter-pole, closed well to get the lead passing the furlong marker then edged clear under strong handling. SR. HENRY set the pace on the inside, was roused coming to the quarter-pole, lost the lead near the furlong marker and was outfinished while just able to hold the place. SKIPADATE brushed with a rival at the start, saved ground on the first turn, moved out early on the backstretch, settled well back in the field, checked near the three-eighths pole and swerved six wide, dropped to four wide near the five-sixteenths pole, lugged in under right hand urging while gaining some ground in mid-stretch and finished willingly to just miss the place. LEMON SPICE brushed with a rival at the start, bobbled in the vicinity of the five-eighths pole, settled in the middle of the field, went three wide on the far turn, held a good position into the final furlong but lacked the needed kick. SUMMER PATRIOT angled in after the start, was unhurried on the inside, checked and shifted over heels near the three-eighths pole, went three to four wide on the far turn and also lacked the needed kick. SHEILA'S MAGIC settled on the inside, checked sharply behind a stopping rival near the three-eighths pole, moved around the aforementioned rival, dropped back to the rail outside the quarter-pole, was within striking range entering the final furlong but lacked the needed response. VEILED PROPHET brushed the gate at the start then quickly angled in, lagged at the rear while off the rail, checked then swerved five wide near the three-eighths pole, dropped to three wide

outside the quarter-pole, angled out behind traffic near the three-sixteenths pole, was in a bit tight when SKIPADATE lugged inward in mid-stretch then failed to rally in a rough trip. PULPIT POINT raced between rivals early then was eased back nearing the first turn, was reserved on the outside, came under a ride while three to four wide on the far turn, remained in good striking position into the final furlong but came up empty. ORTHODOX broke a bit awkwardly, tracked the pace on the outside, dropped to the rail leaving the backstretch and stopped abruptly. (Rail at 18 Feet)
