Footnotes

BWANA CHARLIE trailed along the backstretch after breaking slowly, closed a lengthy gap while saving ground to the turn, angled five wide for clear sailing at the top of the stretch, drew along side POMEROY to challenge inside the furlong marker then edged clear under brisk urging. POMEROY stalked the pace from outside along the backstretch, launched a rally four wide on the turn, accelerated to the front in upper stretch, opened a clear advantage in midstretch, dug in when challenged leaving the furlong marker then yielded to the winner in the final seventy yards. WEIGELIA stumbled at the start, rushed up along the inside, raced just off the pace along the rail leaving the far turn, angled out midway on the turn, split horses at the top of the stretch then finished willingly between rivals to gain a share. SMOKUME was outrun along the backstretch, gradually gained while five wide on the turn, swung six wide to reach contention while just outside the winner at the top of the stretch then flattened out. CLASSY MIGRATION dueled through rapid fractions along the rail for a half and tired from his early efforts. QUICK ACTION battled heads apart from outside to the turn and steadily tired thereafter. MASS MEDIA chased the leaders slightly off the rail to the turn, checked behind WEIGELIA nearing the quarter pole then gave way.
