ECTON PARK raced close up while three wide and well in hand, advanced three wide on the second turn, took the lead approaching the stretch, drew away when roused for the drive and was ridden out to the finish. LEMON DROP KID, close up between rivals while under wraps, advanced inside nearing the stretch, swung wide for the drive and finished well. BADGER GOLD showed in front from the outside on the first turn, set the pace and stayed on stubbornly inside. BEST OF LUCK, hustled along early, was put to the whip on the backstretch, was inside in the stretch but lacked a rally. VICAR, very wide while well in hand on the first turn, raced with the pace while between rivals, earned a short lead on the second turn then tired in the stretch. VISION AND VERSE, close up inside early, angled out into the backstretch, advanced outside on the second turn but came up empty when called on. KEY TO SUCCESS showed speed along the inside, chased the pace and tired.
