Footnotes

JUMP FOR KITTEN came away from the starting gate with no major mishap, was guided over to the inside and sat briefly pocketed off the contested pace, was taken in hand then eased into the two path midpoint on the turn, went on a little further before continuing gradually outward a second time, latched onto the leader three wide at the quarter pole and bid in earnest, made good progress on what proved to be a resilient foe during the run through the furlong grounds, continued on relentlessly, finally wearing down that opponent in the late stages to earn the decision. SAYAAD patiently prompted the early leader down the backstretch, ranged up steadily on the turn to look that rival in the eye by the five-sixteenths marker, took over in short order, was let out just as the winner made his presence at the quarter pole, got hooked in a spirited tussle with that foe, dug in with good determination yet saw the margin sliced down piece by piece, relinquished reluctantly a short distance from the finish line but gamely held the place. ASUNDER raced along the outside in the opening stages, was put along the rail for a respite from the midway point until just past the five-sixteenths pole, was hand urged while angling back to the two path by the head of the stretch, went a few strides into the stretch drive before taken inward a second time, found his best stride leaving the eighth pole, flashing strong late foot to take the show. ENDORPHINS FLY alternated between being two to three wide early on the turn, remained in the three path once the top one was taken outward in the vicinity of the three-eighths pole, spun four wide into the stretch, with a slight of loss of momentum, lacked the needed response. SARJINSKY (IRE) outrun early, was put three wide at the head of the stretch, out finished a par of weak and tired ones. BOOGIE TOO hip checked the left of the starting gate, making light contact with it, tucked over to the rail soon afterwards, vacated the premises late on the turn, angled three wide into the lane under urging, had no impact. BAJAN RHYTHM sprinted clear soon after the start to grab the early advantage, pulled slightly on the left side of the bit proceeding down the backstretch, set the opening split loosely pressed but came under heavier pressure setting the next one, had the runner up draw abreast at the five-sixteenths pole, succumbed readily to the challenge and retreated.
