SILVER TIMBER settled nicely into midpack after a good start and patiently stalked the front runners with the rider atop with a firm hold, availed of the opportunity to duck over to the pocket, with a wall of rivals spread out five deep in the process of being formed at that juncture, waited briefly before availing of a second opportunity, squeezing by rivals along the rail, after a hard used GLORY GAME inadvertently drifted outward just enough to allow passage to his left side, emerged from the furlong holding a clear advantage, but with a host of rivals still in hot pursuit, dug in with good determination and under good handling to successfully fend them off to earn the decision. HOT MONEY unhurried early, commenced to rally from the five path at the head of the stretch and came home with good energy to procure the place. HOLY EGO swung four wide into the stretch, appeared to be moving willingly only to have that progress temporarily halted, stuck behind a tightly-packed wall, coming to the eighth pole, altered course outward for freedom, losing some momentum in the process, then continued on with good courage once straightened away to secure the show. STRONG IMPACT was taken to the rail nearing the end of the backstretch, took the inside route until the three-sixteenths pole, angled outward at that station, split rivals a furlong down the road and came home willingly to garner the last major slice of the pot. CAN'T REFUSE was hustled along leaving the starting gate, but could advance no further than into midpack, raced along the outside, was already under encouragement swinging from the four path into the lane, got out finished. PEGASUS TOMMY D. underwent a three wide pursuit, remained a prominent factor before backing away during the last eighth. CHERNOBYL'S HERO saved ground, was starting to fall back by midpoint on the turn. GLORY GAME the last to leave the starting gate, rushed up to the front from the inside, argued for the lead while racing along the inside, came under heavy pressure by upper stretch and succumbed. EZZY disputed the pace from the two path, folded.
