STAKES Fourstardave H. Grade 2 - Thoroughbred

INNER TURF A HANDICAP FOR THREE YEAR OLDS AND UPWARD. No nomination fee. \$5,000 to pass the entry box. A supplemental nomination fee of \$10,000 will be accepted at any time prior to the publication of weights. All starters including supplemental nominees will receive a \$2,500 rebate. The purse to be divided 60% to the winner, 20% to second, 10% to third, 5% to fourth, 3% to fifth and 2% divided equally among the remaining finishers. Dirt weights to be assigned as follows: Three year olds, 121 lbs.; Older 126 lbs. Non-winners of a Graded Sweepstake on the dirt in 2012-13 allowed 2 lbs.; A sweepstake on the dirt in 2012-13, 4 lbs.; four races on the dirt, 6 lbs. (Maiden, claiming, and restricted allowance races not considered in allowances.) A trophy will be presented to the winning owner. The New York Racing Association reserves the right to transfer this race to the Main Track where dirt allowance weights will apply. In the event that this race is taken off the turf, it may be subject to downgrading upon review by the Graded Stakes Committee. Closed Saturday, July 27, 2013 with 17 Nominations.

**Footnotes**

WISE DAN away in good order, rated kindly while tracking KING KREESEA from the pocket, closed the gap slightly while proceeding down the backstretch, availed of an opportunity to maneuver to the outside upon reaching the five-sixteenths marker, getting cued up and doing so, prior to spinning into the lane, was called upon and took off after the leader in earnest once settled in upper stretch, latched on fully with a furlong remaining, raced on even terms before poking a head past a stubborn rival in the vicinity of the sixteenth marker, had the rider sneak a couple of peeks behind him then kicked away, crossing the finish line under a brisk hand drive. KING KREESEA broke alertly and was almost instantaneously in control, was guided over to the rail, cut the pace, rated along and facing some but light pressure, felt the presence of the winner approaching the quarter pole and was soon let out, had the top one draw alongside after completing the run through the furlong grounds, dug in stubbornly only to yield nonetheless with about a sixteenth remaining, displayed good courage to the end to be second best. LEA broke in a couple of steps at the start, raced three wide on both turns, unleashed an abbreviated run from the three-eighths pole, proved no match for the top twosome. MR. COMMONS quick tucked along the rail after the start, rode it, loping along until the top of the second turn, got tipped outward and then asked for some run by the five-sixteenths pole, commenced the stretch four wide, made no headway. WILLYCONKER (IRE) unhurried along the outside, was sent inward nearing the end of the backstretch, went on to save ground until the quarter pole, was under urging angling back to the outside for the drive home, came up empty. SKYRING attended the runner up from the two path doing so under some coaxing, tired steadily before completing three-quarters.
