JAN'S PERFECT STAR broke on top and kicked away to a clear advantage, was pulling on the bit prior to becoming rank, losing her action midway down the backstretch, had ANN'S SMART DANCER hitch up almost immediately afterwards, sparred head to head for several strides before shaking free once more by the half mile pole, got placed at a slight distance off the rail showing the way under some mild hand urging, arrived at the end of the bend with the closest pursuers getting asked for their best, but remained unasked until a sixteenth later, responded well, gradually extending the margin in the final furlong. ROMAN INVADER saved ground until the quarter pole, was cued up and angled outward coming into the stretch, proved no match for the winner, proceeding down the lane with the rider applying a strong grip on the right side. ANN'S SMART DANCER took an awkward initial step outward, ranged up quickly to confront the top one shortly afterwards, match stride for stride for a brief period before getting shaken off coming to the end of the backstretch, chased the winner from the two path on the turn without seriously pressuring that opponent, weakened steadily after completing a half. EXPRESSION reserved from off the inside for the opening half, swung four wide into the stretch, lacked the needed response. GREED AND FEAR underwent a three wide pursuit on the turn, drifted into the five path entering the stretch, tired.
