EVERYDAY ANGEL took charge soon after the start, opened a clear advantage along the backstretch, extended her margin under her own power on the turn, quickly opened a commanding lead when roused in upper stretch then drew off to a lengthy score while being ridden out. PLAID bumped at the start, raced well back for a half, was caught in traffic while rallying in upper stretch, split rivals to get clear a furlong out then finished willingly to best the others. RAVISHLY was reserved early while well off the rail, circled five wide leaving the turn then rallied mildly to gain a share. ACE'S CAPPELLA raced within striking distance along the rail for a half, angled three wide at the quarter pole then finished evenly. SPENCERS STORM bumped at the start, raced well back along the rail to the turn, was blocked behind a wall of horses then swerved out while altering course in midstretch and failed to threaten thereafter. TAP'N TANGO raced just off the pace while four wide to the top of the stretch and lacked a further response. WESTERN TIMES prompted the pace while three wide to the turn and faded. MARCHING cashed the winner along the rail into upper stretch and gave way. SIMPLY PERFECT never reached contention after breaking slowly.
