Footnotes

SAXOPHONE LEN tucked over to the inside shortly after the start, rode the rail before flip flopping paths with GOOD LAW after that rival crossed over to the rail himself, midway on the first turn, patiently stalked that opponent for nearly six furlongs, crept up nearing the three-eighths pole to latch on, turned for home on nearly even terms, kicked away when given his cue for the stretch drive, remained clear while kept busy to the end. FORTITUDE tracked the front runners while saving ground, doing so under a firm hold by the rider in the initial stages, got eased into the two path just before reaching the quarter pole, swung three wide at the head of the stretch as ROARING CONQUEST was backing away, failed to dent into the winner's margin during the last eighth en route for place honors. ROARING CONQUEST three wide on the far turn, lacked the necessary stretch response. GOOD LAW held a clear advantage upon reaching the opening bend, tucked along the rail shortly before completing the first quarter, set the pace, rated along and facing only mild resistance, came under heavier pressure about midway on the second turn, entered the stretch and soon succumbed. GOOD KARMA underwent a ground-saving journey, was called upon by the five-sixteenths pole, faltered. PURE ATTITUDE raced along the outside and was through after going three-quarters.
