Footnotes

CODETTA away in good order, assumed a forward position without need of encouragement during the straightaway approach to the opening bend, sat reserved along the outside while advancing along with the remainder of the pack towards the loose leader, entered the far turn from the three path, with PRIZE CATCH drafting behind, continued a steady forward march towards the front, still not being urged until the quarter pole, took off in earnest when asked for run after entering the stretch, closed in relentlessly during the ensuing furlong, forged to a narrow edge in the vicinity of the sixteenth pole, dug in

with good determination, with several rivals breathing down, then proceeded to finish gamely on even terms with PRIZE CATCH for the decision. PRIZE CATCH was allowed to settle into stride leaving the starting gate, drafted behind CODETTA from the three path during the run around the second bend, was asked to pick it up a bit under mild encouragement at the five-sixteenths pole, remained glued just off that rival's hind quarters as the pair headed into the lane, tipped outward one additional path settling into upper stretch, responded positively, having been now been fully set down, then charged down the center of the course to finish in a dead heat with CODETTA. UP IN LIGHTS was rank under restraint during the initial stages, acted more kindly upon reaching the opening bend, was unhurried for nearly six furlongs, while racing towards the back of the pack, was asked for a response fanning four wide into the stretch, lost none of the momentum after being straightened away and displayed a strong kick along the outside of the course en route for the show. SMART FARMING rated along the outside, gradually closed a significant gap from the early leader leaving the first turn, continued to inch towards that rival departing the half mile pole, was asked for a response issuing her challenge coming to the quarter pole, gained readily on the front runner, came in a bit from left handed whipping at the eighth pole, shutting down HEY HEY MAMA's path, battled hard, but had to settle for the last major share. HEY HEY MAMA raced towards the inside under a good hold, found room to maneuver into the two path approaching the top of the stretch, lacked optimal racing clearance in upper stretch, angled outward for freedom, narrowed in on the front runners, was forced to steady in traffic a second time coming to the eighth pole when her pathway was closed, altered course sharply inward, taking STERLING SILVER along for the ride, then continued on willingly to the wire. LUCIDA swept past the field leaving the gate to establish early command, bounded along unchallenged until nearing the quarter pole, offered good resistance, before succumbing. STERLING SILVER took the inside route under a snug hold, waited for room off heels coming to the quarter pole, commenced to rally after angling into clearance in upper stretch, appeared to still be in the thick of things, when herded inward by HEY HEY MAMA in deep stretch, eventually getting completing shut off shortly before reaching the finish line. MARCH MISCHIEF between rivals on the second turn, came up empty when asked. PERFECT BERRY guided over to the rail midpoint on the backstretch, never threatened. LIGNUM VITAE raced along the outside and was outrun.
