**Footnotes**

B SHANNY off to a sharp beginning, grabbed early command, angled decisively towards the inside, taking up residence in the two path soon after departing the chute, cut the pace, well rated, began to shake free of the closest pursuers coming to midpoint on the turn, led the field into the lane and was let out, competed the next furlong still in possession of a comfortable advantage, felt the presence of the runner up in the late stages, but dug in well and under good handling to prevail. EL PADRINO took the inside route, cut the corner with good momentum, launched a rail rally to reach contention with an eighth to go, altered course in the late stages, by now just off the leader's heels, nudging GRANDPA LEN slightly more to the outside, gave it a good final try, but had to settle for the place. GRANDPA LEN took up a forward position, placed along the inside, tracked the leader, was taken in hand, in a bit tight at the seven-sixteenths pole, remained within range throughout the run around the bend, angled out for the stretch drive, failed to dent the top one's margin, got gently pushed outward slightly once the second place finisher completed his late maneuver, held well for the show. TRITAP was forced inward several paths by an errant ZELLERS at the start, moved up into midpack, gave chase, staying within range around the bend, was already under encouragement entering the stretch from the two path, continued on willingly to garner the last major award. SAINT HONORE was coaxed along on the turn, travelling towards the inside, got set down entering the stretch, swerved outward a good three paths in response to left handed stick work at the three-sixteenths pole, had the rider tuck it away, then altered course sharply back to the two path with a sixteenth to go, flattened out after ending that wild ride. FIVE SIXTEEN fractions entering the track, had settled down well before loaded into the starting gate, proceeded to come out in good order, raced unhurried towards the back of the pack for nearly a half, went on to improve position belatedly. TRIPENCICULAR underwent a four wide pursuit and folded. FLASHY SUNRISE three wide

departing the half mile pole, swung six wide, the widest of all into the stretch, lacked the needed response. STEVIE JONES raced along the outside and tired. RIGHTFULLY SO chased the pacesetter three wide, was through after completing a half. ZELLERS ducked in after stumbling at the break, carrying inward TRITAP as a result, sat within range off the inside during the opening half, steadily tired thereafter. NEWS PENDING four wide midway on the turn, gave way.
