Footnotes

GINGER PUNCH tucked in along the rail in the early stages, moved between horses entering the backstretch, was unhurried for seven furlongs, moved out midway on the turn, launched a bid four wide at the quarter pole, made a sharp move to challenge in midstretch, battled heads apart under right hand urging into deep stretch and got up in the final jump. LEMON DROP MOM opened a clear advantage nearing the first turn, surrendered the lead just before going a half mile, raced in close contention along the rail to the turn, surged to the front leaving the quarter pole, dug in when challenge in midstretch, maintained a narrow lead into deep stretch and lost the bob. UNBRIDLED BELLE stalked the pace while three wide for six furlongs, ranged up from outside to gain a brief lead at the quarter pole, remained a factor into midstretch and weakened late. INDESCRIBABLE raced well back for a mile, advanced three wide into the stretch and rallied mildly. GOLDEN VELVET contested the pace between horses along the backstretch, maintained a narrow lead to the turn then gave way in upper stretch. SO GLITZY steadied along the rail on the first turn and failed to threaten thereafter while saving ground.
