**Footnotes**

HOPE FOR LOVE settled just off the pace while saving ground, rallied along the inside on the turn, slipped through along the rail to take charge at the top of the stretch then drew off under a vigorous hand ride. WESTERN RUSH moved up between horses to contest the early pace, forced the pace in the two path to the top of the stretch then continued on well to hold the place. BLUEGRASS BELLE stalked the leaders while three wide for a half then finished willingly to gain a share. TACTICAL PLUS raced well back to the turn then failed to threaten with a mild late rally. SWEET SCREAMER trailed for nearly a half after breaking slowly, circled six wide into the stretch then closed late in the middle of the track. CABO SUNRISE raced in close contention just outside the winner to the turn, angled three wide at the quarter pole and lacked a strong closing bid. HOLY SPARK raced in the middle of the pack while saving ground for a half and lacked a strong closing response. PEACE FLAG stumbled soon after the start then failed to mount a serious rally while between rivals. KUANYAN bumped at the start, rushed up along the rail to gain the early advantage, set the pace under pressure to the turn, and gave way in the stretch. SUMMER SCENE was pinched back a bit after being bumped at the start, raced well back while four wide to the top of the stretch and lacked a rally. ASSESS was never a factor while racing wide.
