Footnotes

GUNMAN took the inside route, moved up gradually into contention, waited for EXCHANGINGMEMORIES to go by before angling outward to draft behind that rival into the stretch, tipped outward an additional path in the vicinity of the three-sixteenths pole for better racing room, closed in with good energy departing the furlong marker, surged by the pace combatants with about a sixteenth remaining, and kicked clear, crossing the wire under hand encouragement. LINDELL A. C. was rated while arguing for the lead along the inside, got set down turning for home with LAST HURRAH still battling away on even terms, clung to a narrow edge dueling with the previously mentioned rival during the run through the furlong grounds, was powerless to stave off the top one at the sixteenth pole, but continued on with good courage to garner place honors. LAST HURRAH made a three wide run to press the issue with LINDELL A.C., sparred with that opponent, racing as a team, but with the rider of neither asking his mount for a response until the quarter pole, continued the duel until the sixteenth pole before backing away. EXCHANGINGMEMORIES sat under a firm hold tracking the pace dispute from the pocket, was given his cue, before commencing a three wide angle into the lane from the five-sixteenths pole, flattened out. ALLEN'S STAR steadied off heels in the vicinity of the seven-eighths pole, raced three wide on the far turn, had no rally. TELL GRANT three wide around both turns, folded. LION PRINCE brushed the left side of the starting gate, was strung out three wide for the run around the first turn, travelled in the two path down the backstretch before tucking over to the rail at the half mile pole, saved ground thereafter and went on to improve position by weak and tired ones. GO TO THE NET between rivals for a good portion of the opening three-quarters, tired. BUNDESTAG (GB) attempted a four wide run around the second turn, but wasn't up to the task.
