HAMMOCK strung out three wide on the opening bend, was kept well on hold throughout the pedestrian opening splits, moved in tandem with the SCORPER to take charge leaving the half mile pole, shadowed that rival towards the inside, settling into the two path nearing midpoint on the second turn, got called upon as did the second place finisher as a long duel commenced, raced heads apart with his fellow pace combatant as the pair sprinted away from the rest of the field, continued the lively struggle all during the run through the furlong grounds, began to inch away with about a sixteenth to go to prove best. SCORPER sat reserved along the outside under a snug hold off the pacesetter, was let out a notch after the soft opening half was completed, with the top one likewise making a bid as well, glued directly to the outside, tucked along the rail leaving the seven-sixteenths pole, with HAMMOCK maneuvering to be two wide, still sat on reserve for a little while longer, with neither of the two front runners willing to commit first, got set down almost simultaneously with the winner, went at it head to head with that rival, with only a sliver for a margin separating the two, lost the lead in the vicinity of the sixteenth pole, tried valiantly to re gain it, but had to settle for being second best. LIBERTY CAP contently lagged behind the back of the pack while riding the hedge, was eased out entering the stretch, hesitated while caught in behind rivals before altering course near the three-sixteenths, finished with good, but belatedly to grab the show. ALMORADI (IRE) secured the pocket soon after leaving the starting gate, was rank being rated under a snug hold for a good portion of the initial half, tried to slip off the hedge nearing the end of the backstretch, but found himself hemmed in by VEILED PROPHET, was shuffled back during the run around the far turn, stuck behind the weakening former pacesetter, just as the front runners, each under a drive, kicked clear from the competition, gained sufficient clearance for the stretch run and came home willingly for the last major award. VEILED PROPHET was no factor. ALCOMATCH outrun for nearly three-quarters, was steadied as LIBERTY CAP was taken outward in upper stretch, had no rally. CLOSE TO THE VEST broke on top, was well rated backing down the pace during the early going, readily succumbed when challenged leaving the half mile pole and faltered.
