SO MANY WAYS came away in good order, took up position from along the outside within range of the front runners, chose the three path as the one to take during the run around the bend, ranged up readily once upon it, looking TEEN PAULINE in the eye a few strides before reaching the quarter pole, continued on nearly terms as the pair spun into the stretch, got asked for a response and gave it, shaking free during the ensuing furlong, extended the margin in the last eighth kept to strong handling to the end. SWEET SHIRLEY MAE pulled greenly on the bit racing down the chute, was guided over to the inside at the beginning of the backstretch, swung into the two path after SEASONED WARRIOR took up residence on the rail in the vicinity of the half mile pole, got put to a prolonged drive and made good progress leaving the three-eighths pole, continued onward willingly to garner place honors, although never posing a serious threat to the winner. TEEN PAULINE edged away from field after the start to grab the early advantage, was rated in the two path down the backstretch, with CORAIL making her presence felt one path to her outside, was sent over to the inside at the half mile pole, had the winner arrive on the scene just shy of the five-sixteenths marker, sparred one on one with that rival once CORAIL backed away, got called upon after getting settled into upper stretch, fell back steadily racing through the furlong grounds, eventually weakening into the show slot. SEASONED WARRIOR tucked along the rail nearing the end of the backstretch, got put to a prolonged drive and cut down considerably what had once been a sizeable gap, particularly from the midway point on the turn onward, angled into the four path by the five-sixteenths pole, soon flattened out. CORAIL disputed the pace from the outside until the five-sixteenths pole then retreated.
