Footnotes

HENNY'S HURRICANE raced three to four wide around the turn, was asked for run nearing the five-sixteenths pole, gained gradually during the run through the furlong grounds, closed in more readily when the leader began to shorten stride soon afterwards, wrested the lead in the vicinity of the sixteenth pole and edged away while being kept to the task at hand. NOLITA out broke the field to take the early lead, fought against the bit while being on the front from the two path, with only mild pressure coming from FLYING TRAIN, shook free from that rival approaching the quarter pole, maintained a clear advantage during the ensuing furlong, by now having been put to encouragement, began to shorten stride a few jumps past the eighth pole, offered brief resistance when confronted by the top one with about a sixteenth to go, yielded, but had enough left to be well clear of the others for the place. HURRICANE BARB bumped at the start, saved ground until the eighth pole and was along for the show. FLYING TRAIN chased the leader from the three path, being lightly coaxed along to keep pace, tired after going a half. ROCKABELLA SONG thee wide, was weakening, when checked sharply midstretch to avoid the ill-fated rival. FOREST WHIP bumped at the start, raced along the outside, fell just past the eighth pole, unseating the rider as a result.
