JENNA'S ROSE made the lead, going wire to wire, to be ridden out as the easy winner. CUTIE MILLER broke sharp, then pressed the pace, but was second best. CARDENALA had no early foot from the rail, then rallied between horses down the lane to get up for show. VICTORY DREAM was in contention early, three wide, with a mild bid. BLUES BLUES was near the front, four wide, with an even effort. DESERT FLAG was mid pack, two to three wide, but lacked the needed late response. STEP BY STEP had no speed, on the rail, with no rally. ZIZZA ZU broke slow, then was hustled up to force the pace on the inside, but faded quickly mid stretch. STAR LUCK trailed the field, on the rail and never fired.
