### Footnotes

DOUBLE SMART was forwardly placed early, going two wide, then rallied at the quarter pole and drew off down the lane. BROTHER LOUIE was in contention early, two to three wide, then offered a bid to get up for place. BROTHER JOHN D. was unhurried early along the rail, then angled out on the turn and closed between horses to grab third. CHUCHULUCO made the lead, then gave way at the three sixteenths pole. DESERT GAMBLE was mid pack, two to three wide, made a bid on the turn, but flattened out down the lane. LA SORPRESA had no early foot, going four wide throughout, and offered a mild bid late. SPINNING TOUCH was near the back, on the inside, with mild late interest. SILVER MATTHAIS was in the middle of the pack, on the rail, and dropped back in the stretch. LEFTY WHO pressed the pace, on the inside, then drifted, three wide around the turn and retreated. BOOGER BOO was mid field, three wide and faded at the quarter pole.
