ALMOST SUMMER dueled for the lead, then drew off at the quarter pole for driving finish. BEAU'S HALO chased the pace, then rallied, three to four wide and got up for place. CHARLIE'S SONG dueled for the lead with ALMOST SUMMER but gave way at the quarter pole and held on for third. JERRY LEE WHO was mid pack, three wide, with a mild rally down the stretch. WHAT'S THE RUMPUS pressed the pace, three wide, then faded at the three sixteenth pole. EVER POWERFUL was unhurried early, angled out, going four to five wide, and offered a mild late effort. CADIN'S GOLD was near the back, on the inside, with no late run. REIGN FROM HEAVEN had no early foot, on the rail and never fired. WARREN'S MR. LUCKY was forwardly placed early, four wide and retreated at the quarter pole.
