CHOCOLATE CALIENTE was forwardly placed early, sustained a bid in the turn five wide then surged clear in deep stretch. MARIES FAST LADY forced the early pace, rallied five wide nearing the three sixteenths but was no match late for the winner. STRAIGHT WESTERN was unhurried early then placed a steady gain into the stretch. RAINBOW WEAVER was off slow early, went five wide and placed a mild bid. HENNESSY'S LADY raced mid pack, placed a brief bid along the inside then weakened. FAST ISTINTAJ was off slow early and sustained a mild effort mid track. TRUEFORYOU was never far back early, went six wide and faded. LILY AMORE showed early speed then retreated steadily. RED HOT BERN showed little in a dull effort.
