BARBARIC made the lead, then drew off from the quarter pole to be the easy winner. ME A PACHE had no early foot, then circled horses and closed well, going four wide to get up for place. AGGRAVATED BATTERY broke sharp and stalked the pace, four wide, then offered a mild bid to hold on to show. LESTER GRAY was in contention early, going three to four wide, dropped back around the turn and offered a mild bid late. CASHETE pressed the pace on the rail but faded in the turn. MR. TRAV was near the back, two wide, but lacked the needed late response. JELLYFISH LAKE had no early speed, on the rail and offered no rally. TOUCH OF THE WEST broke well, four wide, but retreated steadily.
