SWISS NIGHTS was sent to the front, set the pace under pressure two wide to the stretch then responded gamely to urging and held. JACK N BEAU'S SON tracked the winner to the turn, bid three then four wide to the stretch and finished willingly through the final furlong. STORMIN AHEAD broke a step slow then was hustled up to also track the pace, raced three wide to the stretch then swung out, responded to vigorous handling in the drive and was gaining late. VALDERON chased the pace early, saved ground and made a run to loom a threat to mid stretch but could not sustain that rally late. UNCLE LOUIE pressed the pace to the turn, was three wide to the stretch then tired through the final eighth. LOUIS WHO was outsprinted to the turn, raced two wide to the stretch then could not muster the needed late response. DON TOMAS N. had no speed and was not a factor. FIFTH STREET GUY also had no speed and was outrun.
