MISTER DIXIE broke well to set the pace for a half and drew off to a long lead without urging. MY BAMBINO was unhurried early, steadily advanced to the three-eighths pole and tired. COMMERSANT stalked the pace to the second turn and tired. BECAUSE I WIN pressed the pace between horses for a half and tired. SCHOOL BOY HEART was in tight quarters into the first turn and steadied behind the winner's heels, steadied again while in tight quarters against the rail near the half-pole and tired. ALKATAS trailed.
