CLASSIC SPEED was well rated shortly after the start, moved up between foes to draw even with the pace setter at the eighth pole, bested that one shortly thereafter and drew clear. MASABI KING was away alertly to take command early, set the pace around the final turn and was caught at the eighth pole by CLASSIC SPEED, gave way to that one then dug in gamely. DISCO CAPOTE pressed the pace from the three path to the lane then held onto show. LENDING FREEZE was well reserved on the inside, offered a run from that path in the stretch but was unable to gain further ground. COWGIRLS FIRST rated along the inside while in contact with the leaders, remained within striking distance but was empty late. GRAND COMMANDER stumbled at the start and was steadied, settled into the two path but had no late bid . DESERT STONE moved well outside at the start, chased the leaders from the outside then offered a brief run, continued racing on the outside, fanning seven wide to the lane but was unable to improve. SILK SPINNER tracked from the three path while never far back then tired after a half mile.
