**Footnotes**

WINTER'S COMING was bumped at the start, steadily advanced into the second turn, rallied on the inside into the stretch, gained command a furlong out and drew off under steady urging. LT. KOJAK stalked the pace on the inside, angled out into the stretch and finished well. DOUBLE DANCER ducked out at the start bumping the winner, sprinted clear to hold at clear lead into the second turn, bore out weakening a furlong out, then bore out badly after two hard whips in the final sixteenth. After an objection by the rider of AMBARONA against DOUBLE DANCER, alleging interference in the stretch, and a stewards inquiry, DOUBLE DANCER was disqualified and placed fourth. AMBARONA was outrun to the second turn, rallied on the outside into the stretch and was forced wide and steadied in the final sixteenth. HANDSOME MAN was well placed and had no rally. ROBIN DIAMOND raced in the middle of the pack and had no rally. RUBBER BANDIT stalked the early pace, bolted entering the backstretch and was done entering the second turn. PINE MOUNTAIN was outrun and bolted into the stretch. TELL GRANT was outrun. UNCLE MORDECAI rushed after a slow start, checked into the first turn, bore out into the backstretch, angled out and was eased.
