LAST LAUGH NOW quickly took command and set the pace in the two-path, was let out a notch drawing away on the second turn, got a reminder to stay on task a furlong out and had a lot more if needed. MARSHALL pressed the pace to the stretch, proved no match for the winner but stayed on willingly in a very good effort. JOE DENUCCI trailed to midway on the second turn, split rivals into the stretch and passed tiring rivals. EVENFOREVER was in tight on the first turn, angled out three-wide on the backstretch, came five-wide into the stretch and gave way. DR. KENNEY raced in the middle of the pack, angled in into the second turn, bore out angling out in the upper stretch and was done. UNTOUCHABLE ROCK pressed the pace on the outside to the second turn, challenged the winner, was repulsed and gave way between horses. WAX ON WAX OFF had only brief speed.
