Footnotes

CAPE TIME showed first, was rated just off the early speed from outside, in path four entering the second bend, was asked leaving that turn, angled in some entering the lane, gained a narrow advantage, battled the last eighth and held sway. SMOKIN' LEGEND was boxed in behind the early speed, got through two wide leaving the quarter pole, fought between horses in the stretch, did not have enough in the waning yards but proved second best. SHOOTER'S TOUCH gradually made up ground between horses on the backstretch, was forced to take the second turn five, floated out to path six entering the stretch, lugged in some as he gained third inside the final furlong, was no match for the top pair but held off A LOT OF MON for the show. A LOT OF MON a bit slow at the break, trailed not far off the inside, started to make up ground from path four on the backstretch, gained a striking position from that path on the second turn, altered in some as SHOOTER'S TOUCH came in deep stretch and could not get by the latter in the waning yards. BANKER'S WAY settled, gradually progressed not far off the inside, in paths two and three through the second bend, also altered in some inside the last eighth as he fought for third and did not have enough left nearing the wire. NEWTONS THEORY bumped with STRIKE A SPIDER at the break, drifted out some while on the front end into the first turn, moved back to the rail after three furlongs, moved ahead and was just off the inside on the second bend, had the rail into the lane, was challenged upper stretch and slowly yielded the final furlong. FAIR MARKET VALUE moved to the rail on the first turn, came off the inside looking for room with five furlongs to go, moved back to the rail into the second bend, closed the gap but could not sustain his bid leaving that turn and gradually retreated. PERSHING without early foot from outside, steadily made up ground widest on the backstretch to threaten six wide on the second turn, fanned out further entering the stretch and wore down. STRIKE A SPIDER bumped with NEWTONS THEORY at the start, was carried out by the latter on the first bend, vied for the lead just outside NEWTONS THEORY for more than six furlongs then gave way.
