Footnotes

WILD ROLL was allowed to settle early racing along the inside, angled out four wide at the top of the stretch, wore down his foes and edged clear. FINISH LINE AHEAD was never far back early, vied between rivals into the turn, finished well in the stretch and was gaining. HUNTERS WINE moved up between foes to draw clear, held to deep stretch, was challenged by closing rival then yielded. PESCADERO was outrun early, went five wide at the quarter pole and showed a mild effort late. SHOOTER'S TOUCH prompted the early pace from the inside then faded. YES HE'S A PISTOL stalked the early leader, placed a brief bid then gave way. TURNBOLT trailed the field saving ground and was always outrun.
