Footnotes

THE HUNT IS ON was within striking distance early, sustained a bid four wide leaving the quarter pole, dueled in deep stretch, dug in the final yards and was best late. RUTHERFORD was forwardly placed early along the inside, rallied near the eighth pole, lacked room then altered out at the sixteenth and finished gamely. HIS SONG was allowed to settle early five wide, angled in to save some ground in the turn, then shifted outward near the sixteenth pole and was gaining late. TIGER BAY forced the early pace, gained a clear advantage in the turn, was challenged in deep stretch and gave way grudgingly. VICTOR WACO was off slow early and placed a mild effort late. PERKINSVILLE was outrun early, raced wide into the turn, went wide late and failed to menace. OKLAHOMA MULE was void of early speed and showed little. A. J. DA SKIPPER showed some brief speed between foes racing off the rail and stopped.
