PEAKABOO SUE raced mid early, swung three wide into the turn, vied for the lead at the three sixteenths pole and held the second place finisher off for the win. WILD ENTHUSIASM lagged early, advanced four wide into the turn and was closing fast on the winner. STARTING BELL unhurried early, angled out six wide into the turn and rallied belatedly. BABE'S BONNIE BABE pressed the early pace, angled out at the top of the stretch and steadily faded. MARIA'S EMERALD raced mid pack early, advanced five wide into the turn and finished evenly. SARA SARA stalked the early pace setters and offered no response. TIME FOR MARY set the early pace to the quarter pole and steadily weakened in the stride. LA CONQUISTA was never a threat.
