Footnotes

HOMEMAKER settled in the second flight, rallied three wide through traffic entering the stretch, took over from RAMA LASSIE leaving the furlong grounds and drew off under a hand drive. SATINE was three wide around the turn, angled out further for room at the head of the lane and got up for second money in the final yards. RAMA LASSIE vied for the early lead three wide between horses, disposed of those rivals to be briefly clear entering the stretch but could not contain the winner and weakened late. AMARAS raced within reach of the front-runners but had nothing left to rally on the drive. SPEEDY FALCON got jostled about from either side after the break, recovered quickly to set a pressured early pace along the rail but gradually flattened out in the lane. BERRY VIVA broke outward and bumped into SPEEDY FALCON, then angled five wide on the turn and improved position down the stretch. BUGSY MARRONE pressed the issue from four wide around the turn only to tire in the drive. GOOD CHARLOTTE failed to make a bid racing wide. GOODIES GALORE angled towards the inside but proved no threat. ONLY SEVENTEEN was not a factor from outside. MISS NOTEWORTHY veered out right after the break, then moved to the rail and soon tired. MARQUEE broke in and bumped SPEEDY FALCON, then vied for the lead two wide around the turn before faltering in the stretch.
