Footnotes

GHOSTLY WITCH kept close between horses, was blocked two and three wide on the turn, checked behind traffic at the head of the lane, altered out five wide, rallied, gradually lugged in deep stretch but caught SNOWBALL SMARTY at the wire. SNOWBALL SMARTY pressed from outside, was three then four wide taking the turn, moved clear inside the final furlong, slowly lugged in deep stretch, tried hard but was outfinished in a game effort. BEAU'S BABE prominent from inside, was blocked just off the inside leaving the bend, got through along the rail at the top of the stretch, dueled for the lead but did not have enough left inside the final eighth. STEPPIN COWGIRL contested the pace between horses, was two wide leaving the turn and slowly yielded deep stretch. SECRET TREASURE dueled for the lead just off the inside, took the rail on the turn, floated out some entering the stretch and gradually wore down the last furlong. SIMPLY SOURCE was away slowly, had the rail on the turn, swung out to path three into the lane and gradually angled out for a clear path as she made up ground. AUNT JUDY broke outward, trailed from outside, three to five wide taking the bend and was empty for the drive.
