**Footnotes**

JANNAS PRIDE gradually progressed from outside, was five wide on the second turn, angled in some leaving that bend, took over upper stretch, weaved some under a drive as he began to move clear, was all out the final furlong and held on. DEITY was settled inside, angled out as he picked up his pace on the second turn, swung out five wide leaving that bend, altered in some when his path was taken at the head of the lane, rallied between horses, moved inside JANNAS PRIDE deep stretch and caught DESERT GULCH for the place. DESERT GULCH progressed from inside, angled out some on the second turn, was three wide leaving the bend, altered out abruptly at the top of the stretch, steadily made up ground six wide, had second with a sixteenth to go but was outfinished. NUMBERONESON contested the pace between rivals, was in path three on the second turn, had the lead leaving that bend, could not stay with JANNAS PRIDE upper stretch and slowly wore down the last eighth. IT'S TERA crowded briefly at the start, was in midpack from outside, lost ground taking the second turn five to seven wide and began to wear down deep stretch. MOSTLY DUST unruly in the gate, was away slowly, failed to menace running widest most of the way but passed tired ones through the lane. BEAU WIZER broke on top and outward, was quickly corrected, pressed the early speed from outside, four wide into the second bend, angled in some entering the stretch and gradually faded. SILENT SUNDAY vied for the lead along or just off the rail for nearly seven furlongs then began to tire. KEDDY KAUFAYE in contention just off the inside, lost position on the second bend, swung out four wide for the stretch run and continued to fade. TEXAS SILVER boxed in behind the early speed, was steadied behind traffic while along the rail leaving the second turn then steadily gave way. Due to a rain/snow mix, the half mile call was obstructed.
