TITLE CONTENDER pressured the pace setting MONGOLIAN SATURDAY while racing in the three path into the second turn, gave up some ground to that one entering the stretch then dug in gamely under left handed urging nearing the eighth pole to make the lead in deep stretch and proved best under energetic handling. BRAVEMAN bobbled a bit at the start then was under strong restraint around the first turn, settled within striking distance in the four path, rallied steadily through the stretch and finished second best. HANDSOME TIGER unhurried for six furlongs, was steadily gaining ground late four wide. MONGOLIAN SATURDAY set a pressured pace into the second turn, opened a clear advantage approaching the quarter pole, set the pace until deep stretch then was outfinished. ACT OF MADNESS went evenly. SILVER TONGUED dropped far back before a half, trailed into the stretch then passed a tiring rival late. FIERY MARCO away alertly, was in a bit tight along the rail nearing the six furlong pole while pressing the pace, remained a sharp threat until the top of the stretch then stopped.
