Footnotes

LIVE THE DASH bobbed slightly at the break, was a bit rank between rivals around the first turn, dropped in towards the rail nearing the wire the first time, raced under a snug hold while keen to go on nearing the clubhouse turn, relaxed under nice handling while continuing to save ground down the backstretch in a forward position, sat patiently leaving the far turn, edged closer along the rail nearing the eighth pole, shifted out four to five wide for the drive, responded to enthusiastic right handed encouragement and forged clear through the final sixty yards. DANE AUSTIN cleared early, set a slow pace, raced removed from the rail into the lane and gave way grudgingly. CHANGING FUNDS saved ground early, angled out three to four wide past the half mile marker, moved under urging past the three eighths pole, chased the leader around the final turn and came up empty. SUPAH PRINCE was not a solid threat. VEER, wide early stalking the pace, angled in and faded. R. B. FLOAT dropped back.
