Footnotes

TOASTIE'S CROWN broke in mid pack, gained steadily racing down the backstretch outside and well clear, rallied wide, took command at the quarter pole and wore down rivals through the drive. LAST PENNY, unhurried at the start, improved position coming to the turn, moved in tandem with the rally of the winner from the inside, swung outside at the quarter mile marker, and finished well up the stretch for place. ICE TRICK dropped back at the outset, rated last around the turn, rallied sharply off the turn, was gaining, but found best stride late. LITTLE SNAKE BIT, off well, gave way to the early pace contenders, raced in tight quarters between horses around the turn, but got clear and went evenly late. SAUCY MO unhurried at the break, moved up gradually through the turn, and posted a mild stretch gain. NEAT PEAK was never a factor and showed little although passed tiring horses. SONOITA SLEW broke fast, dueled from the outside, gained advantage in the late turn at the quarter pole, then gave way in the stretch drive tired. WINSOME MERIT sent hard from the gate, was through after a half mile and stopped.
