Footnotes

JOE BLACK SANDY stalked the pace, rallied between horses on the far turn to challenge, dueled past the eighth pole, inched clear and was all out at the wire. AFRICAN GRAY stalked the pace, bid inside on the second turn, was blocked through the upper stretch, altered course before the eighth pole and closed fast once straightened. SUB DUE FORCE was off a bit slowly, unhurried early, saved ground, bid along the rail on the turn, angled out in the upper stretch and closed well to earn show. TATLER JACK angled in on the first turn to press the pace along the rail, assumed command into the second turn, responded when challenged to duel past the eighth pole and faltered. ONE'S OWN ACCORD lagged while never far off the pace, failed to rally and did not menace. TASTE OF BATTLE was sent to the front to set the pace, bore out on the first turn, vied well off rail to the second turn, bore out and dropped back.
