Footnotes

SLIVEN came out some at the start and drew clear early, showed the way to the lane and edged away through the final furlong, a driving winner. SHINE'N TIME up close early, saved ground and finished willingly while second best. DANCE THE DANCE trailed to the lane then offered a belated gain. TULELAKE raced four wide on the turn and lacked the needed response. WHAT A DAY broke awkwardly, raced near the rail on the turn, was in the three path entering the lane and lacked a stretch bid. JACKSONVILLE bumped with a rival leaving the gate, chased and weakened in the drive. PISTOIA loaded without the rider, saved ground and lacked a rally. STRAIGHT WESTERN bumped leaving the gate, chased three wide on the turn, was just off the inside turning for home and tired.
