Footnotes

PISTOIA set a pressured pace to the turn, drew off for a clear lead, was shortening strides but held well under steady urging. SCRATCHTHEMOON was never far off the pace, angled out at the top of the lane, bid seven wide, found her best stride late and was gaining ground. MYAH'S ROSE pressed the pace, challenged between horses on the turn, continued willingly and was gaining late. ROSIANA was slow early, raced wide and finished well. STRAIGHT WESTERN pressed the pace outside, challenged three across on the turn, fell back and finished evenly. PROUD BLUE RIDGE saved ground, had no stretch response and was outrun. SHOT FOR GRANDMA pressed the pace outside and gave way into the turn.
