Footnotes

HIGHDRUM saved ground while racing close to the pace, was boxed in and awaited room on the turn, bid between horses at the top of the stretch, inched away for a short lead near the eighth pole and held well in a driving finish. BRAHMS INFERNO was never far off the pace, rallied four wide on the turn to challenge, swung wide entering the stretch, bid willingly and was outfinished. GAMBLER BILL vied inside to mid stretch, weakened, fell back but held safely for show. MODERN GENTLEMAN saved ground to the turn, angled out, bid five wide at the top of the stretch, bore in through the drive under steady left handed urging and failed to gain ground. BEARS EARS vied two wide to the second turn, weakened and faded from contention. COY BOY HANSUM TOY fell back early to trail and showed little. TALKIN MCCARTY bolted.
