ACCEPT THE KISS lodged a bid on the turn and raced between rivals passing the quarter pole, was in the four path into the lane and finished gamely to prevail. EMPIRE HOUSE saved ground while forwardly placed, eased out to the three path entering the stretch and reached the front passing the sixteenth pole then continued on gamely while unable to contain the top one. ENGINEER rank at the start and outside on the turn, appeared to be pushed out slightly turning for home and raced five wide into the lane then also finished gamely. BROTHER JIM set the early pace, was headed nearing the lane, stayed inside and regained the advantage nearing the eighth pole then tired late. SOUVENIR WINNER bumped leaving the gate and outrun into the lane, offered a mild late gain. FURIOUS GEORGE in a bit tight at the start, chased three wide, was between rivals turning for home and tired. JANZIG AFFAIR between foes into the turn, was along the inside into the lane and lacked the needed response. MAROZI in tight leaving the gate, moved to the front between calls passing the quarter pole then tired in the drive. TWO ONE GUN in tight leaving the gate, lacked a rally. A claim of foul by the rider of ENGINEER against the winner for interference in the vicinity of the quarter pole was not allowed.
