FATHER JOHN M angled in to save ground to the far turn, angled out late backstretch to rally five and six wide through the turn and into the lane then drove clear under steady handling. SUNNIE DO IT settled outside, rallied four wide into the lane, had aim upper stretch then could not match the winner's late run. ELMIRA GULCH dueled outside, gained a clear lead to upper stretch and weakened. AVIE'S LADY, along the inside, moved through a tight opening into the lane to loom a threat but proved no match in the drive. MS. ANNETTA saved ground and failed to seriously threaten. MISS THE BLUES had good position in the middle of pack, was in traffic on the far turn and offered no late run. SCARLETT MARY stalked the pace in good striking position outside, and tired while four wide through the far turn. DIAMOND JASMINE, wide early, pressed the pace outside, made her bid between rivals on the far turn and tired. FANTANGO LADY dueled along the inside and gave way badly upon reaching the stretch.
